## Team SunSmart<sup>TM</sup> Program Launches in NJ High Schools

# Yogi Berra, Foundation Board Member, encourages all athletes to include sunscreen in their equipment bag

Montclair, NJ, March 4, 2011 – The Ray Festa Melanoma Foundation (RFMF) is pleased to announce the launch of Team SunSmart<sup>TM</sup>, an exciting new program designed to educate student athletes in New Jersey about the damaging effects of too much sun exposure. Some scientists estimate that a child who wears sunscreen everyday will cut his or her risk of developing skin cancer as an adult by as much as 70%. This spring, Team SunSmart<sup>TM</sup> will provide sunscreen to as many as 86,000 athletes from across the state (that's more than 2,700 teams from 400+ schools) while educating them about the necessity of applying sunscreen prior to outdoor practices or games and reapplying often throughout the day.

**Yogi Berra**, **Yankee Hall of Famer and RFMF Advisory Board Member**, said, "This is a great idea! I wish we knew when we were kids that we should wear sunscreen – I might not have all of these wrinkles now. I know guys who have had lots of moles removed, so I want to make sure all of the kids today wear sunscreen and put it in their equipment bags so they always have it."

"The hope is that before players lace up their cleats or put on their protective padding, they will apply a generous layer of sunscreen to their faces, arms, legs and any other areas of exposed skin," says **Teri Festa, president of the Ray Festa Melanoma Foundation (RFMF)**, which is committed to educating everyone on the importance of the prevention and early detection of melanoma.

Knowing that teens are a particularly vulnerable group, the RFMF has partnered with the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJSIAA) to introduce the Team SunSmart<sup>TM</sup> education program. Information about skin cancer, UV exposure and the positive impact sunscreen protection will be disseminated to athletic directors and coaches across the state who, in turn, will educate the student-athletes on up to 2,700 teams. The RFMF anticipates the message of living SunSmart<sup>TM</sup> to reach the entire student body at many schools.

"Throughout the outdoor sporting seasons, New Jersey student athletes often are in the sun for prolonged periods of time and we want to help make sure they are protected," says **Steven Timko**, **NJSIAA executive director**. "Education is our first line of defense and with the cooperation of athletic directors and coaches across the state, we are confident that we can make some significant changes in the behavior of our student-athletes."

In addition to sunscreen and educational materials, the RFMF has created a Facebook Fan page and a Team SunSmart<sup>TM</sup> Video Contest to help spread the word amongst teens. In time, the RFMF hopes to make Team SunSmart<sup>TM</sup> a national awareness program.
